LC Meets with Premier, Leader of Opposition and MLA for Northside

Leadership Cayman (LC) recently held its sixth seminar which focused on the topic of You and Your Government. This particular seminar was organised to provide an opportunity for LC group members to meet with members of the Legislative Assembly and discuss current issues facing our country and explore possible resolutions. Speakers for the seminar were Premier, Hon. W. McKeever Bush, OBE, JP, Hon. Alden McLaughlin Jr., Leader of the Opposition, and Mr. D. Ezzard Miller, North Side MLA, Independent. Planning Committee representative was Wil Pineau, CCE, and seminar sponsor was Cayman National. The LC group is the first private sector group to have been given a tour of the new Government Administration Building.

The Chamber's Leadership Cayman programme (LC) was developed in answer to a need to ensure men and women of all types of backgrounds could access the information and experience to help them develop as leaders within our community. The six-month programme is designed to allow participants a deeper understanding of social, economic, business and political issues affecting us all, whilst they develop their own personal leadership styles and nourish their community spirit.

Class members interact with diverse, high-level community leaders and decision makers by organising and attending a series of seminars and retreats in areas ranging from business, government, education, media, social services, criminal justice, diversity, the arts and more. Meeting typically every other Wednesday of the month (5:00 – 9:00 p.m.), the LC group forges strong friendships as they take this inspiring journey together.
